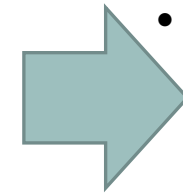

## Multi-Site Targeted Pilots

### *NAP-NYC: Cohort 1*

- Dedicated training and support to cohorts of 5-8 agencies
- Program package for comprehensive training, support & measurement
- Facilitate learning community within the sector
- Stakeholder education & engagement throughout
- Evaluate and share results to educate and advocate
- Inform development of large-scale system initiative



## Large-Scale System Initiative

- Funded via public/private partnerships
- Developed in partnership with funders and jurisdictions or agencies
- Pilot agencies participate at more intensive levels – more clinicians per agency and will expand to include more agencies over time.
- Include extensive outreach and education to stakeholders
- Partner with external researcher to evaluate project and inform the field

# What does the NAP-NYC Pilot Include?

One year of comprehensive training, support & results tracking

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Up to 8 agencies *[40 clinicians]*

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Exploration activities and stakeholder meetings

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Onboarding assistance and preparation

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Initial Training – 36 hours

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Post-training implementation support (bi-weekly case discussions, coaching, manager discussions, learning community)

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Results tracking System (RTS), agency reports, and ongoing project assessment

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Three quarterly advanced trainings for the cohort

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Access to monthly trainings through NAP network

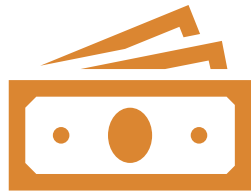
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Replacement clinicians can receive initial training at nominal cost of \$500

*\*Cost in year two: NAP membership (\$1200/year/clinician) for ongoing clinical support, advanced training, and results tracking*

# What about equipment?

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Agencies will receive a grant of 5K per set of equipment directly from the NAP



The grant covers a one-year lease at \$400/month, plus \$200 for supplies

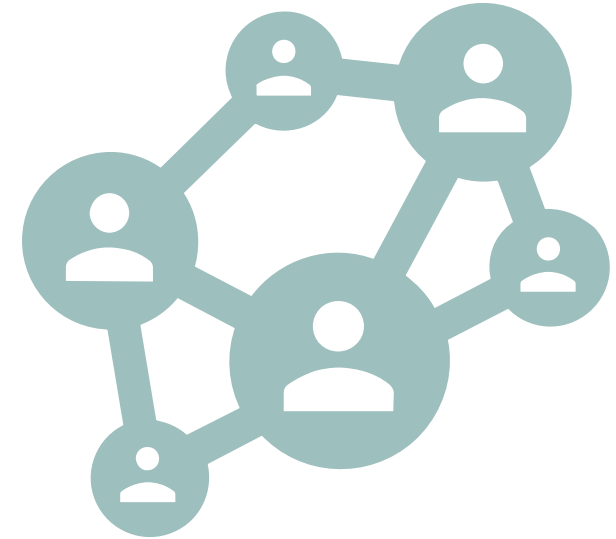


At the end of the year, agencies will have the opportunity to buy-out the equipment (6-8k)

# Who are we looking for in pilot partners?

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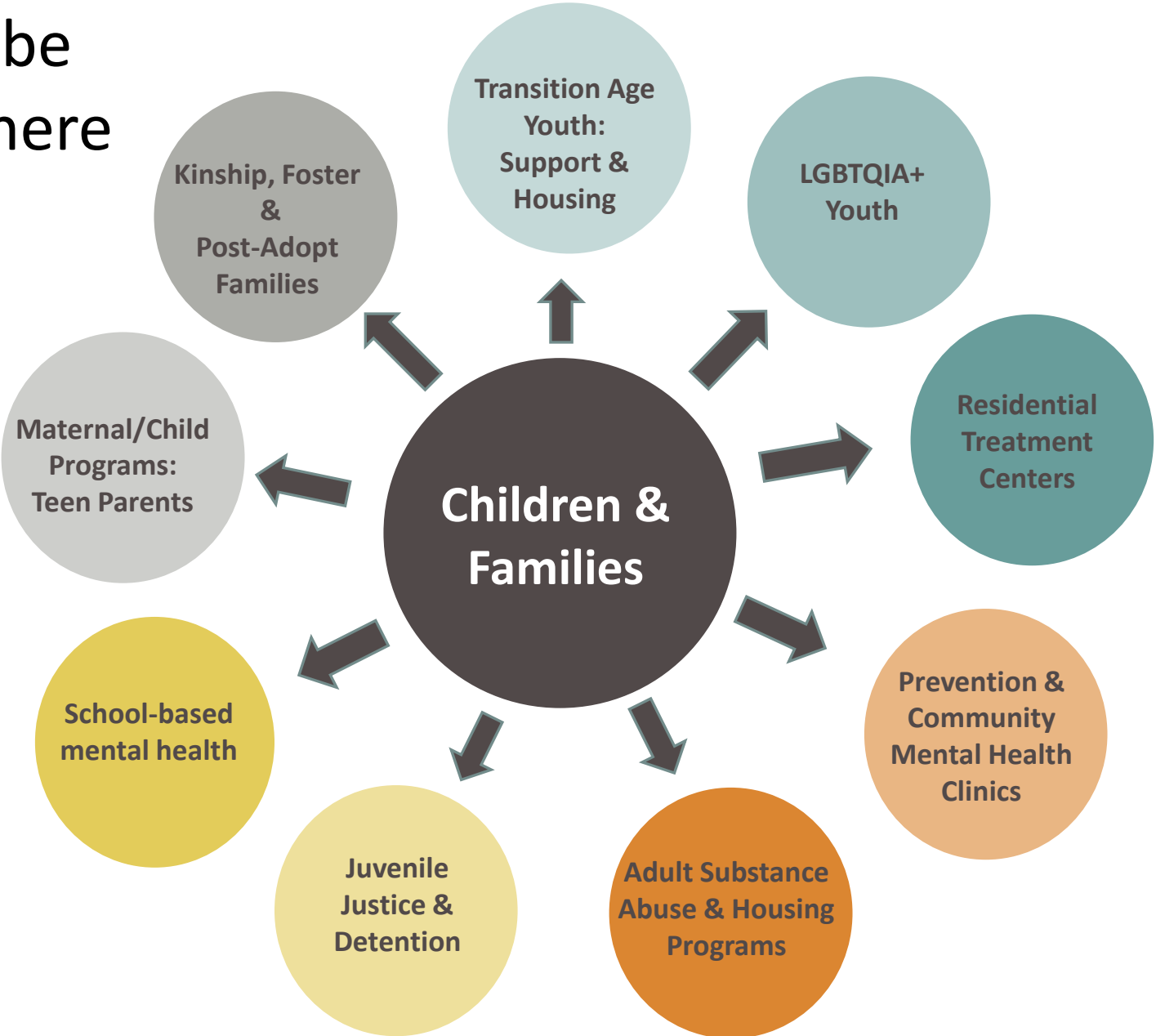
- ❑ Leaders who are not satisfied with the status quo
- ❑ Leadership that supports innovation and cares about results
- ❑ Programs committed to ongoing learning and that can commit to the grant activities
- ❑ Partners who want to collaborate to address implementation issues and advocate for long-term sustainability
- ❑ Partners who will serve as ambassadors and champions as they see the potential in this intervention

# Implementation Process

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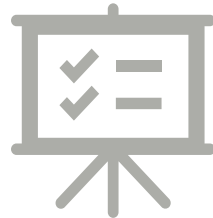


1. Secured funding commitment for 40 clinicians and equipment.

Agencies will be rolled out over several training sessions.



2. Meet with interested agencies to share the pilot goals and expectations, answer questions, identify early implementation challenges agencies may raise



3. Agencies submit a letter of interest that identifies: initial implementation plan, number of clinicians and devices they anticipate being able to support, and confirms leadership's commitment

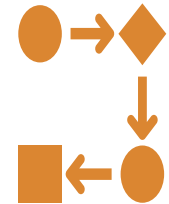

4. Project team (NAP and funding partner) reviews letters of interest and determine final programs and numbers



5. Notify agencies, secure agreements, begin grant process with agencies



6. Begin implementation steps and get first agencies registered for September/October or November training!
